


# Khartoum Process

## What is the Khartoum Process?

The EU-Horn of Africa Migration Route Initiative (Khartoum Process) is a regional migration dialogue. It serves as a platform for political cooperation amongst the countries along the migration route between the Horn of Africa and Europe and facilitates collaboration and information exchange.

## Strategic Framework

As per the Rome Declaration, the thematic focus of the dialogue is tackling human trafficking and people smuggling. Since then and due to the ever-changing nature of migration realities and challenges, the Khartoum Process has expanded its scope to address concerns within the five domains of the Joint Valletta Action Plan (JVAP) and beyond.

## **ABOUT THE ROME DECLARATION**

On 28 November 2014, the Khartoum Process member states and the EU met in Rome for a Ministerial Conference and signed a Declaration agreeing to undertake concrete actions to prevent and tackle the challenges of trafficking in human beings and smuggling of migrants between the Horn of Africa and Europe, in a spirit of partnership, shared responsibility, and cooperation. The Declaration defines priority areas for cooperation, on a voluntary basis.

### 5 DOMAINS OF THE JVAP

- 1. Development benefits of migration & addressing root causes of irregular migration and forced displacement
- 2. Legal migration and mobility
- **3.** Protection and asylum
- **4.** Migrant smuggling and trafficking in human beings
- **5.** Return, readmission, reintegration

# Priority areas of the Egyptian Chairmanship

- Legal Migration, Mobilisation of Skills, and Legal Pathways: This priority aims to explore the legal frameworks and pathways for migration between the Horn of Africa and Europe.
- Humanitarian-Development-Peace Nexus: This priority area emphasises the interdependencies between humanitarian aid, development assistance and peacebuilding. Addressing and utilising this integrated approach requires coordinated and simultaneous actions across the three areas.
- Nexus between Displacement and Climate Change: Under this theme, the Khartoum Process aims to discuss the relationship between climate change, displacement, and conflict.
- Burden- and Responsibility-Sharing in Migration Context: This cross-cutting topic will focus on the responsibility and burden-sharing aspects of current migration frameworks and policies. The aim is to facilitate a comprehensive discussion among stakeholders to identify practical strategies and collaborative approaches.
- Tools for Combatting Smuggling of Migrants (SoM) and Trafficking in Human Beings (THB): The Khartoum Process aims to further explore thematic workshops for practitioners in the field to combat human trafficking and migrant smuggling.
